

Vani Rajendran, clarinet

Vani, originally from the US, began playing the clarinet at the age of 10. When she was 16, she won the opportunity to perform as a soloist with the Houston Civic Symphony, and since then has played in a number of orchestras in the US, Germany, and Spain, and has taken every opportunity to explore the chamber music repertoire. Around Oxford, she can be seen in OUPhil, OUSinf, and most recently OULikelt, a wind quintet made up of the principal wind players from OUPhil. She just started her DPhil in Neuroscience and, perhaps unsurprisingly, she is studying the auditory system.

Matt Rattley, bassoon

Matt began playing the bassoon at 15, and quickly made his way into the music scene in Brighton. He was joint principal bassoon in Brighton Youth Orchestra, and played in a number of small ensembles, including a bassoon quartet that won a number of competitions on the south coast.
